SEA employee wins top UK engineering graduate award

The Graduate 100 awards is a new initiative, developed in conjunction with Britain's leading employers, universities and key industry figures, to identify the top UK graduates in a number of fields including engineering, finance, law, and others. Over 13,000 entrants were nominated by their university heads of department and selected based upon their academic scores, industry experience, and extra-curricular activities.

SEA employee, Andrew Bacon, received the prestigious prize for the top UK Engineering Graduate. He received his award from Andrew Renouf, a representative from TATA Steel, the organization who sponsored the engineering prize at the award dinner at the London Hilton Metropole.

After brushing shoulders with Dragon's Den star James Caan and receiving a message of congratulations from the Prime Minister David Cameron, Andrew said: "It was a great honour to receive this award which recognised the work I put into my university projects and as the co-lead of the Space Generation Advisory Council's asteroid working group.
